Here is a list of suggested synagogues for your site visit. Please select one and plan to attend the Friday night service. One page write ups are due Nov. 1 in class.

Note: typically people dress up for these services, so business casual is usually appropriate. You should consult the synogogue's website for sepcific dress codes.

Public Transportation

Temple Israel is located two blocks from the Longwood Station along the Green Line's Riverside route, and two blocks in the other direction from several bus routes that stop near Beth Israel/Deaconness Hospital. The #39 bus that travels from Copley Square to Forest Hills Station stops at Mass College of Art on the corner of Longwood Ave. and Huntington Ave., which is less than a mile from the Temple. We are also about 4/5 of a mile from Coolidge Corner.
